Dear Robert:

I am sending the enclosed bills to you for presentation to the Board of Examiners at their mid-month meeting in order to obtain an early payment, for in the case of bills for clothing a discount has been given for cash or 30 days.

The cabin on the East Walker has been completed and bedding sent to Lammille Canyon. We shall send two other sets of bedding to be used at other cabins in the Walker Basin at Buckeye and Leavitt Meadows. We should ask the next Legislature for an additional cabin at Sonora Pass.

I have not yet received extra copies of the Mason Valley News dated September 26. Look up the copy in the Library and show it to Governor Scrugham. The headline runs something like this: Snow survey proves correct and saves crops. It should help us in obtaining larger appropriations at the next Legislature.

I am looking forward to meeting you, as you suggest, on one of your early trips to Reno to talk Pyramid and Humboldt.
