TO ALL CONCERNED:

Your attention is particularly called to the provisions of Chapter 129, Statutes of Nevada, 1921, which provides: "Only citizens or wards of the United States or persons who have been honorably discharged from the military service of the United States shall be employed by any officer of the State of Nevada, or by any contractor with the State of Nevada, or any political subdivision of the state, or by any person acting under or for such officer or contractor, in the construction of public works or in any office or department of the State of Nevada, or political sub-division of the state, ***"

Violations of the provisions of this Act are punishable by a fine of from \$100 to \$500 and imprisonment up to six months. The penalties provided for in this Act shall not apply where violations THEREOF ARE DUE TO MISREPRESENTATIONS MADE BY THE EMPLOYEE OR EMPLOYEES, BY THE PRODUCTION OF FRAUDULENT PAPERS EVIDENCING CITIZENSHIP IN THE UNITED STATES.

It would seem from this that in all cases where there is any doubt about the citizenship of an employe, he should be required to produce his citizenship papers.

I am instructed by the President on behalf of the Board of Regents to call your attention to the provisions of this Act, and to instruct you that you should in all cases comply with the letter as well as the spirit of the Act.
