Dear Dad:

I finally got a chance to get your bills typed up and gave them to Miss Fletcher (Allen's Chief Clerk). She said that she saw John Brooks some two or three days ago regarding the balances in the two funds. According to her data, John segregated the amounts ax incorrectly (and admitted it) so that the balances were not correct tho the total of the two was. Consequently, the entire Meyer's bill was placed against the Cabin Fund and 50¢ of your stamp reimbursement also.
