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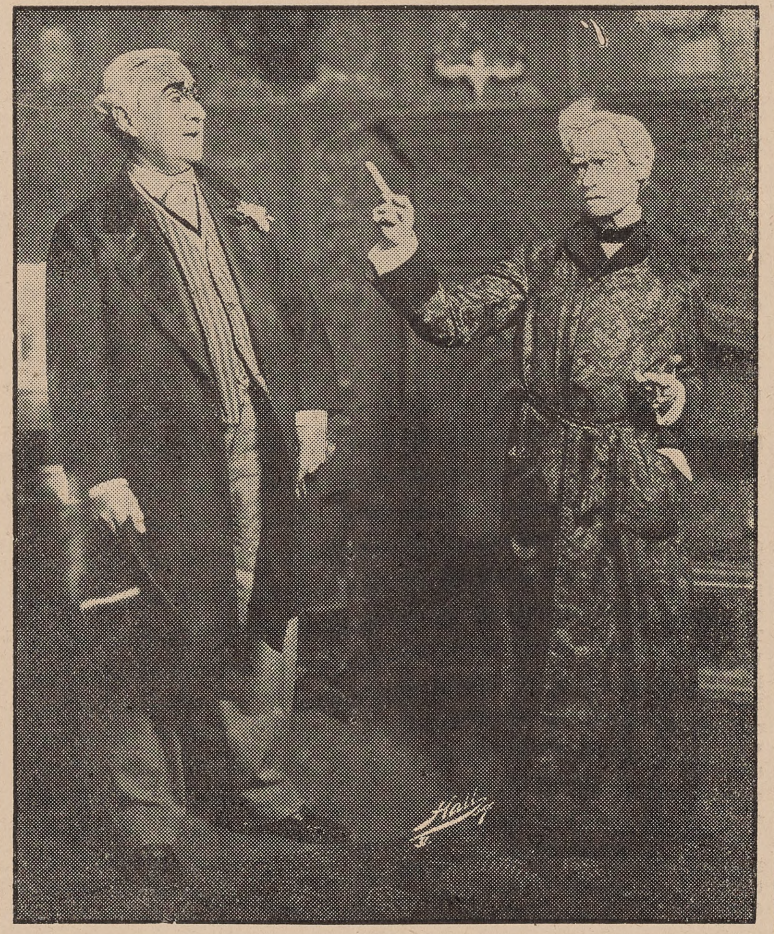
It is quite possible "to flunk" on "The Sagebrush" and we cannot send papers to those who will not subscribe.
