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

The third quarter showed Nevada at her worst and the Frosh took advantage of this temporary relapse to run two touchdowns over. The first was made by straight football, when they started from their 40-yard line and with a series of line bucks and drives over tackle with a forward pass to help out took the ball to Nevada's 10yard line from which point it was easy for them to buck it over for the touchdown that tied the score. The second touchdown for the Frosh followed closely on the first, and was due almost entirely to poor playing on the part of Nevada. To start with Witter passed the ball over Bradshaw's head

on Nevada's 40-yard line, and Brad recovered it on the 15-yard line, then Grant helped things along by making the only poor kick he made during the entire game and the ball went out of point the Frosh had no difficulty in carrying the ball over for a touchdown which should never have been made and which gave the Frosh the necessary points to win the game.

After this period of poor playing the Sagebrushers seemed to recover and played whirlwind football until the end of the game. In the fourth quarter Bradshaw tried two forward passes, one to Martin and the other to Jones, either one of which if caught would have probably gone for a score. In both cases the ball just barely touched the finger tips of those players and it seemed as if luck was against them. Finally however with about three minutes left to play Hobbs caught a 40yard forward pass and was stopped at the Frosh 30-yard line, another pass to Johnson took the ball to their 15yard line but here luck turned again and the pistol ended the game, when it looked like Nevada was sure to score. The team as a whole played an ex-

cellent game of real honest to goodness football and are a bunch to be proud of. The line played an exceedingly better game than any one expected of them although there is considerable room for improvement. Witter played a steady smashing game and is sure to develop into a very good center. Tiny and Buck played the guard positions throughout the game and were getting through time and again to break up plays behind the line. The tackle positions were somewhat weak, and are the ones which will have to be strengthened a lot in order to make the line all that it should be. Wright played a good and steady game; Al Reed and Heward, who replaced him, undoubtly did their best, but there were times when there were holes there as big as a mountain. Bill Martin proved an end who was as good as any seen on the field that afternoon, and that was some good.
