
University Libraries celebrates Artown

"This collection is special because it presents governmental reports from the Bureau of Land Management and the United States Forest Service that are not easy to find online in addition to correspondence sent to the public Commission," Kim Anderson, director of Special Collections and University Archives said. "This collection is of benefit to anyone needing access to these reports – regardless of which side of the issue they fall on."
