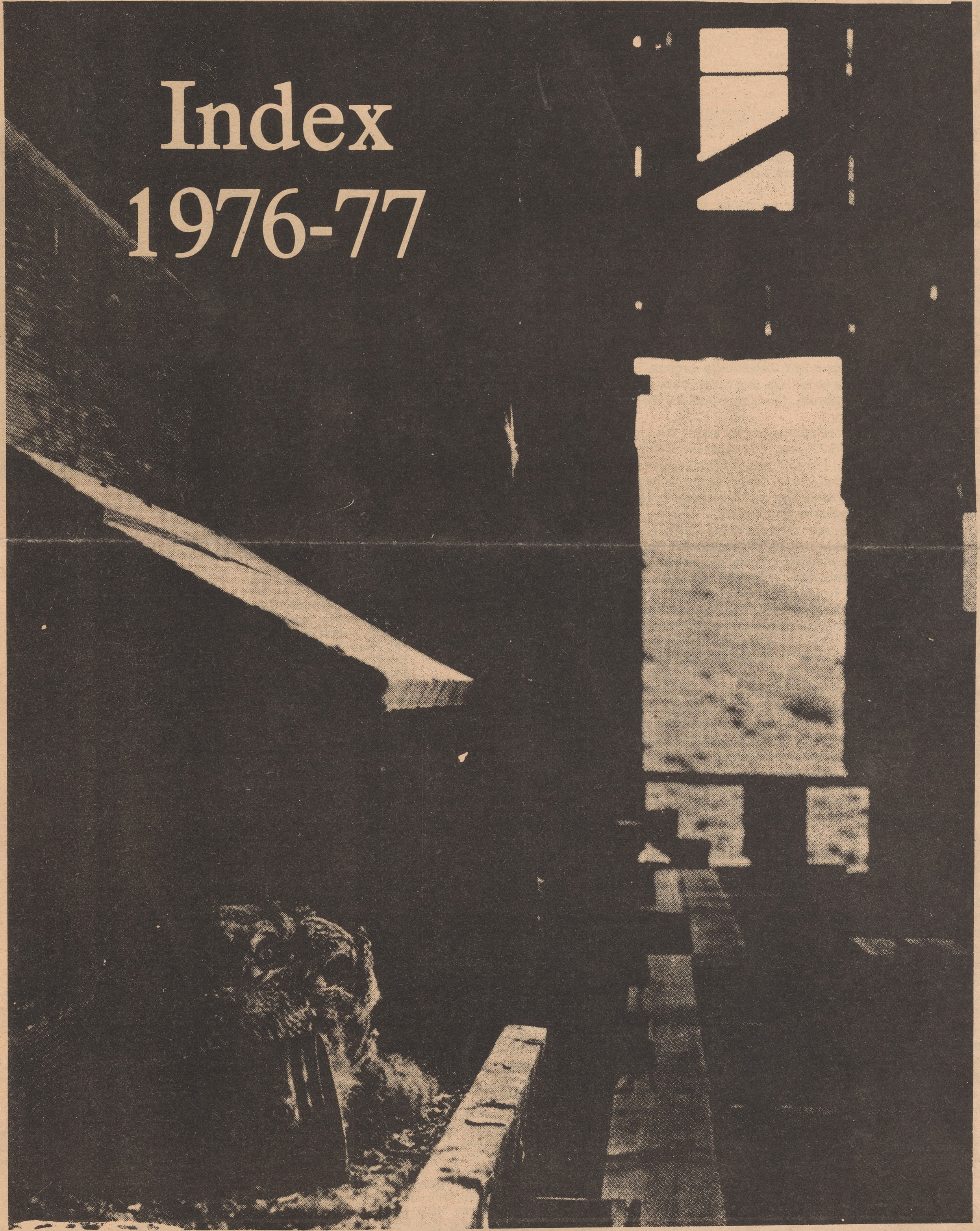

# Sagebrush Index 1976-77

This index owes much to the earlier efforts of Bruce Krueger, who indexed the SAGEBRUSH for three years, beginning with the very first such publication in 1974.

That first index contained three sections, for subjects, writers and art. It was a very basic kind of index.

The following year (1974-75), Bruce had it a little easier with assistance from 'BRUSH staffer Kim Peterson, but then for the third index (1975-76) Bruce was back to doing it alone. That third index was a little more refined than the original one. For example, all names were designated "S" (student), "F" (faculty), "A" (administrator), and so on. He also included the following sentence in his introduction to the index: "Intangible concepts of right and wrong, and good and evil DO exist, and when we are willing to offer up our moralizations, rather than shrinking from the mere mention of them, then those intangible concepts might dialectically become universal: something that might do us all some good." On that note, Bruce permanently laid down the task of indexing Sagebrush. (He now works for the New York Historical Society in New York City.)

The development of this index says a lot about the trials of the 'BRUSH and its staff during the 1976-77 year. The paper went through three editors in as many months, and so, I'm told, did this index. Whole sections were lost, the page numbering system lost its correct sequence between editors, and ultimately, instead of the usual nine months available for compilation of the index, it was rushed together in four weeks.

One new feature this year: The index of artists and photographers has been split into two indexes, one for photographers, the other for the various artists, illustrators and cartoonists. There was also an early intention to split the subject index into two, one for general news, the other for sports news. In the end, the idea was dropped for lack of time.

And, one idea left behind by Bruce Krueger was considered but only partially adopted. In his last index, Bruce wrote: "One fascinating idea occurred during mid-November: 'Why not index pictures as well?' A great idea, but also a great amount of work. Needless to say, the idea was immediately dropped. Maybe next year." Well, no, not this year either. Indexing the photos by subject as well as photographer would have been extremely time-consuming. Captions were seldom used, so subject indexing of the photos would have required a lot of footwork to establish the who, what, when, so on for each photo. No way. However, in many instances, the designation (photo) appears in the subject index where it applies to the entry.

Several things need explanation.

Issue number 38 and issue number 39 both carry the same date on the cover ONLY. The correct date for issue 38 is February 15.

There are really two sets of index page numbers: those carried, usually, at the top of each page in the 'BRUSH, and the correct ones, which are listed in a table elsewhere in this index. This is so, principally, because of a shift in the page numbers from issue 43 to issue 44. 43 ends with page 516 (according to the page top numbers), but then 44 begins with page 522. From that issue on, the page-top numbers fluctuate two or three times, usually being four pages discrepant. Thus, in order to use this index with success, disregard the page-top numbers, and use only the table printed herein. For example, should you wish to find the entry listed in the subject index for John McCaskill on page 517, turn to the table and find the issue which has the page number in it. In this case, it would be pages 517 to 532, issue 44, March 11, 16-page issue. (If you tried to find page 517 with the page-top numbers, you would find there is no such page.)

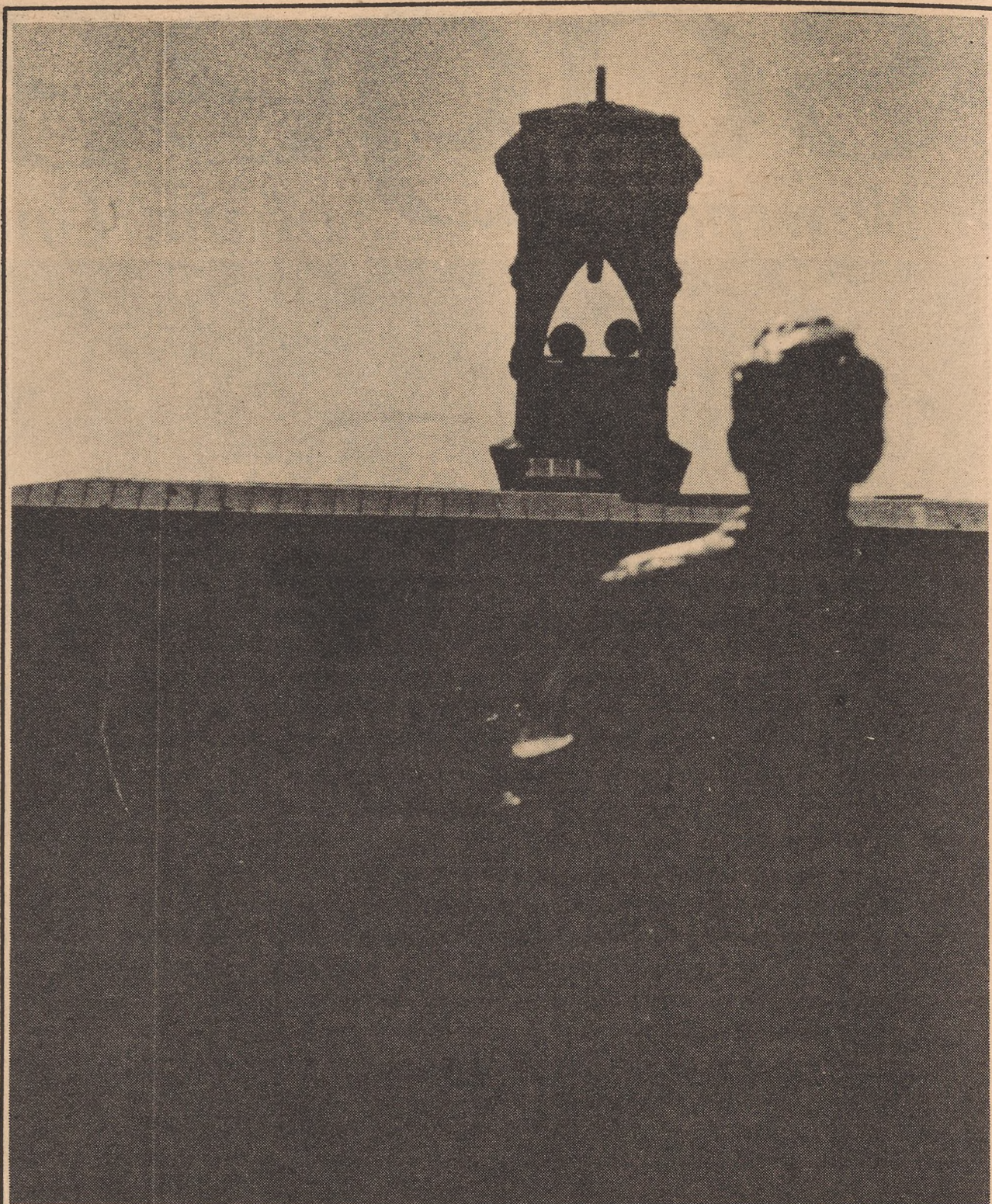
Finally, on page 186 (issue 16, October 26) there is a correction which needs to be corrected. The first line of the correction refers to "issue 16, October 22." In fact, the October 22 issue is number 15. That's the way it was last year—even our corrections were wrong.

A last note of thanks to those who helped me on this project—particularly Anne Opitz and Perry Fry.

In his first introduction to the first index, Krueger, as he was commonly known (mainly by me), gave the only sensible reason for taking on a project like this:

"Oh. By the way, the only reason I decided to do this index is so that I could get the last word."
